گیاه *Digera muricata* (L.) Mart. که از منطقه جالق در بلوچستان جمع آوری شده است برای اولین بار از فلور ایران گزارش می گردد.

Digera muricata (L.) Mart. (Fig. 1).

Balouchestan: Saravan towards Jalgh, 28 km. S. of Jalgh, Kallegan, 850 m., 22.8.1994 Mirkamali.

This plant which was reported in the Flora Iranica area from Afghanistan and Pakistan (cf. Aellen 1972, p. 15), is the first gathering from Iran.

Digera muricata is an annual, glabrous plant. Inflorescence up to 12 cm long, spike-like, slender, peduncles much longer than the leaves and pedicels very short. Seeds lenticular.

Distr. gen.: Afghanistan, Pakistan, Asia & Tropica Africa.
