## LACTUCA TATARICA, A BEAUTIFUL SPECIES FROM EAST OF IRAN

Lactuca tatarica is a very beautiful species which is recorded for the first time from East of Iran. The species is compared with its close relative L. wilhelmsiana.

گونه Lactuca tatarica گونه ای بسیار زیبا از این جنس است که برای اولین بار از شرق ابران گزارش می شود. این گونه یا کونه نزدیک خود L. wilhelmsiana مقایسه می شود.

## Introduction

As a result of an intensive floral and botanical explorations in Iran in recent years, the Central Herbarium of Tehran University has obtained numerous collections. The collections include new records for Iran and new species to science, of these *Lactuca tatarica* C.A.Mey. (Compositae, Lactuceae) is reported and illustrated here.

Lactuca tatarica C. A. Mey. (Compositae, Lactuceae)

Khorasan: Mashhad, Kalat-e Naderi road, Hezar-Masjed mountains, Jarf road, around Khanzu village, Ghehreman, Attar and Mehdigholi, 1373 m, 27673-TUH.

Lactuca tatarica is recorded for the first time from Iran. This genus has now 11 species in Iran (Rechinger 1977). This beautiful rare species is most closely allied to L. wilhelmsiana Fisch. & C. A. Mey. in DC.

which was collected once by Wendelbo from Panjab in Haraz valley, Mazandaran province (see Rechinger, l. c.).

Lactuca tatarica is distributed in East of Afghanistan, Pakistan and Himalaya mountains.

Differences between Lactuca tatarica and L. wilhelmsiana are as follows: bracts without black spotts dorsally (black-spotted in L. wilhemsiana); achene suddenly discolored rostrate (achene gradually concolored rostrate in L. wilhelmsiana); ligular flowers 15-20, pale pink (10-15 and yellow in L. wilhelmsiana).
